Paul's Trial Before Agrippa: Acts 25-26

1. What stood out to you from Paul's testimony (see Acts 26:4–11, 22–29)?
2. When have you shared your story, like Paul here, as a way to communicate the gospel with someone?
3. In the sermon, Chad talked about the importance of your unique context—where you live, work, and play—for sharing the gospel. How have you shared your faith with people in one of those contexts?
4. Paul said, "Short time or long, I want you to be like me . . ." Are you in a place where you can say to people, "I want you to be like me"? Or does something need to change in your life before you can genuinely want that for people?
5. Chad mentioned the "short game" and "long game" of evangelism. What is the difference? How can you grow in reaching people, either in the short game or long game?
6. What was one takeaway from the sermon or from the text (Acts 25–26) that you can act upon this week? Are you willing to commit to taking action?
7. On Sunday, we were asked to write a person's name on a card at the end of the sermon. If you wrote someone's name down, whose name did you write?
