Group Discussion Guide

1. We have journeyed through Hebrews since February. What has stood out to you the most as you've listened to sermons, had conversations with others, and read through this book of the bible?

2. **Read Leviticus 20:26** –You are to be **holy** to me because I, the Lord, am **holy**, and I have set you apart from the nations to be my own.

Why is the “because” so important as we strive for holiness?
Describe what it means to be ‘set apart from the nations to be my own’.

3. What areas of your life did you think weren't necessary to live out in holiness that you now know must be surrendered to God's will and obey God's call to be holy? (some examples: sexual sin, gossip, books, parenting, selfishness.....)

4. Bobby discussed Moses and the consequences of his disobedience and how it was referred back to in Hebrews.

Read: **Numbers 20:12** – But the LORD said to Moses and Aaron, “Because you did not trust in me enough to honor me as **holy** in the sight of the Israelites, you will not bring this community into the land I give them.”

Deuteronomy 4:21-24 – The LORD was angry with me because of you, and he solemnly swore that I would not cross the Jordan and enter the good land the LORD your God is giving you as your inheritance ... For the LORD your **God is a consuming fire**, a jealous God.

Hebrews 12:28-29 – Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, Let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our **“God is a consuming fire.”**

Hebrews 10:26-27 – If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left, but only a fearful expectation of judgment and of raging fire that will consume the enemies of God.

5. How do the scriptures in question 4 and the description Bobby gave in his sermon impact your daily life and how you share these passages with others?

6. What is your take home for this week from the conversation you've had today?
