Repentance: The Doorway to Salvation

Read Luke 13:1-9

1. What is Jesus saying to those who think they may be more righteous than others?
2. As it relates to repentance, how does this affect the way you view yourself and others?
3. How does this passage describe the grace of God, but also the limits of his patience?
In what ways should this instill a sense of urgency in us?

Read Luke 13:22-30

4. What is this passage saying to those who believe that listening to and being intrigued by the teachings of Jesus should gain them entry to eternal life? Or maybe it's because they've been raised in a generational faith culture (ie. cultural christianity)? Do you see this belief adhered to by anyone close to you (Where you live, work, and play)? What can be done to help them see the truth?
5. Revival is currently the desire of many Christians in America but it will never happen apart from repentance and confession. What should this look like (personally and corporately)?

ACTION:

1) What are the areas in your own life that you haven't let Jesus be Lord of? What sins have been left unconfessed? Make time this week to repent and confess them to Jesus. If you're able, meet with a trusted friend and share your struggle. Scripture says we're strengthened and healed when we go to God together with these things (James 5:16).

2) If you feel comfortable, share with the group the names of some people in your life for whom you are praying will repent and turn to Jesus? Assign a volunteer to make a list so that the group is able to pray for them regularly. Revisit the list periodically at the end of your meeting time, lifting these people up to Lord in prayer.
