How have you seen God working in your life or in the lives of others this week?

Carefully read through John 15:1-17 and answer the questions below.

1. What does “abiding in Christ” look like in your everyday life right now?
2. What are the reasons for the times you’ve felt disconnected to Jesus?
3. Jesus says the Father prunes fruitful branches (v.2). Can you identify a time when God used a difficult season to shape or refine you? What fruit came from it?
4. “Apart from me you can do nothing” (v.5). In what areas of your life are you most tempted to rely on your own strength instead of remaining dependent on Christ?
5. Jesus connects love and obedience (v.9–10). How have you experienced the relationship between loving Jesus and obeying Him? Does obedience feel burdensome or life-giving to you right now?
6. “Love one another as I have loved you” (v.12). Who is God calling you to love more intentionally or sacrificially and what will that look like?
7. Jesus calls His disciples friends (v.15). How does viewing yourself as a friend of Jesus (not just a servant) change the way you relate to Him in prayer, trust, and mission?
