



Let's Be Good Samaritans

Leaders: *Don't feel pressured to get through every question during your group time. Our hope is that your group experiences honest conversation & goes deeper in God's Word—not that you finish the entire list. Feel free to choose the questions that best fit the needs of your group & allow the Holy Spirit to guide your discussion.*

1. What most stood out to you about the sermon on the Good Samaritan and Serve Day? Why?
2. Read Luke 10:25-37
3. When you hear “love your neighbor as yourself,” whom do you instinctively include—and whom do you quietly leave off the list? What does that reveal about a possible need to let Luke 10:25-37 more deeply transform your heart?
4. The priest and the Levite saw the wounded man and passed by. Can you think of any area in your life right now where you might be “seeing” someone in need and choosing the other side of the road—because of time, risk, inconvenience, or dislike?
5. Jesus made the hero a Samaritan—the last person the lawyer expected. When Jesus used a Samaritan it was highly offensive to Jews. It was like using a Muslim Imam for Christians to be the hero. Who is your “Samaritan”? What group, type of person, or individual would surprise you if they were the one who actually showed you mercy?
6. The Samaritan used his own oil, wine, animal, time, and money, then promised to return. What would it actually cost you—time, money, reputation, comfort, or safety—to treat one specific person as a neighbor this week?
7. Jesus flipped the lawyer's question from “Who is my neighbor?” to “Who proved to be a neighbor?” When have you been the one in the ditch? Who stopped for you, and how did that change how you see mercy?
8. Jesus ends with “Go and do likewise.” How can we use “Serve Day” to focus on people in need as our way of life? Explain.
